

# Coming soon: a lot more space for cycling on Tavistock Place

*Better for cyclists. Clearer for pedestrians. Fewer motor vehicles.*

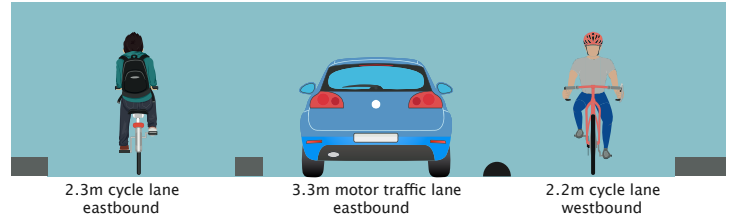
At the end of November Camden Council will change the road layout on Tavistock Place for a trial period of one year. Between Gower Street and Judd Street, motor vehicles will only be able to go east using just one traffic lane. The other traffic lane will be converted to a westbound cycle track and the existing two-way track will become a wide eastbound track.

This is the busiest street for cycling in Camden and one of the busiest in London with more than 1000 cyclists using it every hour at peak times.

The number of cyclists on it has grown to a point where the existing cycle track does not provide sufficient space, risking collisions with other cyclists and making it difficult to overtake safely. Pedestrians and drivers find the current two-way track confusing and there are risks of collisions when motor vehicles turn across it.

We think the new scheme makes the route safer, quicker and more pleasant for cyclists. And by reducing the number of motor vehicles it should improve air quality and increase the safety of pedestrians.
