3. Report on Campaigns and Active Management meeting

Report on Campaigns and Active Management meeting. Jean invited to discuss local groups and how they can be taught to campaign. Advice was given for local groups to "meet and greet" new members by email or face to face. Not possible at the moment due to GDPR. Action: Change LCC Policy. Simon Clarke will ask LCC board if 1 or 2 people in the local group could be entrusted with the information on new members.

4. Holborn Liveable Neighbourhood

Holborn Liveable Neighbourhood. George on behalf of Jean

TfL have awarded £9.5m to Camden for their proposal to create a Liveable Neighbourhood encompassing the Holborn gyratory and extending eastwards to link up with the Clerkenwell Boulevard project. The total budget is £12.5m. (There is a detailed description and map on the Camden Cyclists website). To include

- Theobalds Road: 2 way with protected cycle lane
- Bloomsbury Way: buses and cycles only
- High Holborn: 2 way with protected cycle lanes
- New Station entrance for Holborn Station on Procter street which will be closed
- Grt. Russell Street in front of British Museum: cycle and pedestrianise
- New Oxford Street between Museum Street and High Holborn: cycle and pedestrianise

Funding £12.5 million available. Consultations and public engagement to begin.

Action: Recruit campaigning group.

5. Euston Circus danger: West End Project John

Gower Street will be 2 way but just south bound for the next year due to roadworks. Tottenham Crt. Rd. buses and cycles only all day. To open at Easter.

Unsafe junction Euston Rd. Hampstead Road and Tottenham Crt. Rd. Action: John wrote to Camden about the junction and Simon Munk offered to take the matter up with TFL.

6. Website Query from Cycle Islington:

How is the Camden Cyclists website so good, especially with reference to publication of information concerning interactions with Camden staff? John pointed out that we are responsible for minuting the quarterly infrastructure progress meetings between CCC and Camden officers. A draft is prepared by George/Jean and submitted to the officers for approval before they go on our website. In advance of each quarterly meeting a spreadsheet showing the current status of ongoing projects and proposed schemes is circulated and updated by council officers. These meetings are now attended by David Harrison of London Living Streets and his participation has been entirely positive. Action: To share with Nick..... Cycle Islington.

7. Any Other Business

The very poor outcome of Camden Council's website 'upgrade' was discussed. Very many links within the site are broken and much of the important information such as minutes of past Council and Committee meetings is difficult or impossible to find. This remains a major problem several months after the launch of the new website. The Camden IT staff are totally unresponsive.
