Swiss Cottage Setback

Work to remove the hostile Swiss Cottage Gyratory has been put on hold indefinitely, following Westminster's judicial review challenge to TfL for the lack of traffic modelling.



Traffic modelling had occurred for the whole of the CS11 scheme but not for Swiss Cottage in isolation. When gyratory removal was about to start, Westminster halted this for fear of displaced traffic creating local problems. Simon Munk has written a full post on https://
