3. Over taking & queuing in cycle lanes

A lively discussion ensued with several examples of bike lanes in Camden including crossing from Midland Road to Judd Street. Several observations were made; mirrors can be good, look forward to see if the lane is narrowing, behaviour matures over time (as seen on the Embankment). 5. Kilburn High Road

Jean presented what is known about this joint Camden/Brent scheme. The timescales for it coming to consultation are not clear - it has a long history! Highlights:

- Very little for cycling on KHR itself.
- Proposed alignments for Q3 & C51.
- KHR seen as a barrier and several crossing points are proposed by the planners. [See the presentation here](#)

Cycle storage email received from member about the difficulties of cycle hangers:

Issues with the Falco hangars reported:

- It is difficult to lock your bike inside the hangar.
- It is very difficult to close the hangar.
- The pod is always full of leaves and rubbish.
- Lack of maintenance.
- Low occupation (but not able to get a space).

Action: Steve to pass the members email to Camden & ask for engagement with CCC on solutions (Done). Question: Do other Boroughs have better hangar utilisation?
